

COME THEREOF.

The Wonderful Adventures of Six Virginia Slaves Who Were Whirled Through the Ocean's Foam to Liberty and to Fortune.

In 1796 a colony of six runaway slaves came to the Stockbridge valley, the first of that race ever seen in Madison county, The history of these six slaves is full of romance, for they were no common men. They had seen all parts of the world where a ship could ride at anchor in a harbor. All could speak several tongues, out by their master for 21 years on a whaling vessel that was owned by a company in New Bedford, Mass. The ship had started for the south sea, to be gone on a cruise of three years.

When about 50 miles out at sea from large whale and ordered these six sailors to go in a small boat and follow the whale.
