Alarmed At Freedom Granted To American Vessels

A memorandum has been prepared by Barlow Cumberland for presentation to the government... The marine section of the Toronto board of trade views with alarm and surprise the statement made by the public press regarding the suspension of the coasting laws of Canada.

The marine section now makes the following supplementary statement in view of the reported action of the government... The demand made upon the government is that the general favor even granted to the American vessels.
