## A SMART ENGAGEMENT.

### Four British Were Killed and Eight Wounded.

London, Dec. 15.—The war office has received the following dispatch from the officer commanding at Orange river, Thursday, Dec. 14th: "Yesterday part of the mounted infantry under Capt. Bradshaw and the Yorkshire and Lancashire guides, under MacFarran, were engaged in the direction of Ramah and Orange river, about ten miles east of the Orange river, to reconnoitre and report the strength of the enemy reported to be holding the drift. The mounted infantry from 1 to 8 strong detachment of the enemy at the drift and a sharp engagement ensued. The enemy ultimately retreated to Gammansburg. Capt. Bradshaw and three men were killed. Lieut. Grey, of the 1st Buffs, and seven men were wounded. The British had five men killed and several wounded."
