NEW YORK, Aug. 19 -A special from Washington eays: There have been conferences between Estrada l'alma and other representatives of the Cubans, with otherals of the United States government relative to the Cubans and what would be done with them. Mr. Palma was advised that the United would not consider the question of corpensation of the Cuban troops becau-e there was no power in the government to do so, even if there was an intention.


