

Murderer Bram's Attorneys Take Advantage of a Chauge of Law. Bosros, Mass., Sept. 28. - Thomas M. Dr. Nancy Guilford Under Police Bram, the convicted murderer of Capt. Nash, of the barkentine Herbert Fuller, now serving a life sentence in state prison, may yet be a free man, and if his attorneys calculations prove to be correct he will never again be tried for the Merbert Fuller murder. James S. Cotter and A-a French, Bram's lawyers, will soon appear before the United States court and apply for a writ of habeas corpus for the release of Bram from prison, on the ground that

As that time the penalty upon conviction for the crime was capital punishment. Since that time a new act has been passed by congress, giving the jury the right to recommend either life imprisonment or capital punishment upon a
