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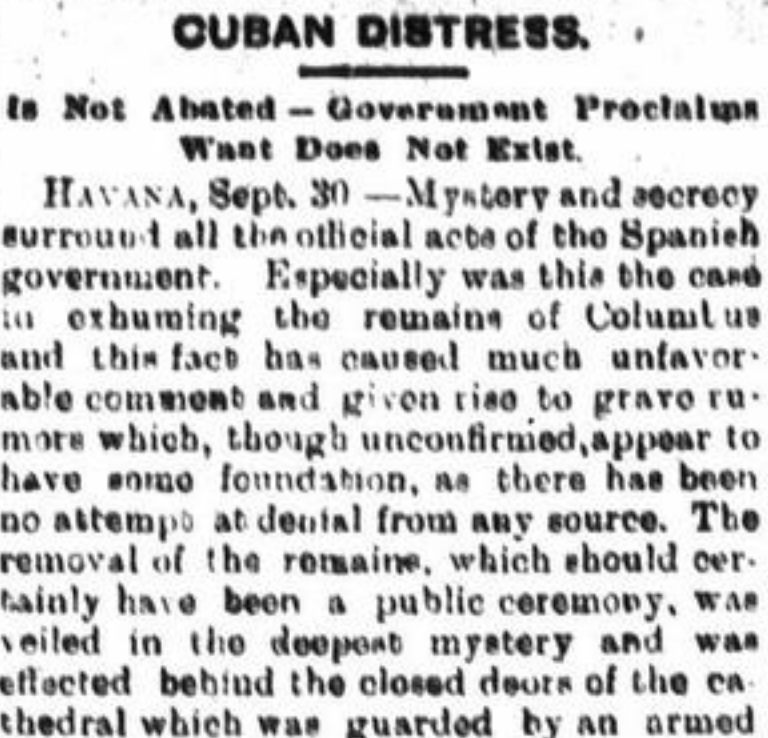

NEW YORK STATE TICKET.

Major Van Wyck's Brother For Governor. SYRACUSE, N.Y., Sept. 30 The democratic convention of New York state at its convention yesterday named this ticket:

For governor, August Van Wyck, Brooklyn; for lieutenant-governor, Elmer D. Smith, Chemung; for secretary of state, George W. Batten, Niagara; for controller, Edward S. Arwater, Dutchess; for state treasurer, E. P. Nantz, Warren; for attorney-general, Thomas F. Conway, Otsego; for state engineer and surveyor, Martin Schenck, Rensselaer.

The nominee for governor is a justice of the supreme court and a brother of major Van Wyck, New York. The springing of his name on the convention by Richard Croker was a complete surprise to a majority of the delegates, but the boss of Tammany can change just about as he pleased, and his man was named on the first ballot.
