Want Does Not Exist. HAVANA, Sept. 30 -Mystery and secrecy surround all the official acts of the Spanish government. Especially was this the case exhuming the remains of Columbus and this fact has caused much unfavorable comment and given rise to grave rumore which, though unconfirmed, appear to have some foundation, as there has been no attempt at deptal from any source. The removal of the remaine, which should cer tainly have been a public ceremony, was veiled in the deepest mystery and was effected behind the closed doors of the cathedral which was guarded by an armed
