MUNICIPAL AUDITS.

Justice Ferguson has given judgment in the case of the county of Simcoe vs. London Guaranty & Accident Co. He has held the defendants liable on the \$10,000 bond of the late defaulting treasurer of the county on the ground that the surety guarantees the honesty of the person employed and is not entitled to be relieved from his obligation because the employer fails to use all the means in his power to guard against the consequences. "This judgment seems to be as reasonable as it is good in law," says the Hamilton Times, "and will tend to make guarantee bonds more valuable and guarantors more prompt in compelling municipal corporations to regularly audit their office's books and discharge the securities." The fact that a council has had an audit will not do. That audit must be complete and competent, must be such as will satisfy the guarantee company that the work has been well and truly done. In the Frontenac case the sureties had a grievance in that the books were audited from year to year and certified to be correct. They felt that they should not be held liable for any shortage occurring within this time, that the auditors' certificates relieved them of further responsibility. The court sets aside this contention. It holds the security liable for any deficiency of funds irrespective of the audit. What follows? That the guarantee company must see to it that the audits are made by competent persons and failing to secure this they must withdraw the security. That is the only alternative.

RESULT OF SUITE.

It has been contended that a life company is liable for the amount of insurance that is covered by one who commits suicide. The New York Life company has disposed of this contention by winning the case, in which it was the defendant, which went to the court of appeal, and in which \$7,000 was at stake. The question was the sanity or insanity of the assured parties when death occurred. The decision of the court was:

"That the assured understands what he is doing, and the consequences of his acts to himself as well as to others; in other words, if he understands, as a man of sound mind would, the consequences to follow from his contemplated suicide, to his character, his family and others, and is able to comprehend the wrongfulness of what he is about to do, as a sane man would, then he is to be regarded as sane.

"That if a policy effected by a person expressly provides for payment if the assured in sound mind takes his own life, the contract will be held to be void as against public policy in that it tempts or encourages the assured to commit suicide in order to make provision for those dependent upon him, and the case is not different in principle if the policy be silent as to suicide, and the death of the assured is brought about by his wilful, deliberate act, when in sound mind." 169 U.S. 129.

What becomes of the theory that every man is insane when he commits suicide? By this decision it is reiterated that men, in taking their lives, can be quite sensible of what they are doing, that they can be quite conscious of what will follow their destruction. The frequency of suicide in insurance cases makes the decision one of very great importance.
