A GLIMPSE OF ITALY.

STRANGE WAYS OF DOING THINGS IN THAT SUNNY LAND.

A Peculiar Custom Which Would Bother an American—A Roman Funeral in a Strange and Startling Sight to a Stranger.

An old adage says, "When in Rome, do as the Romans do." But it is a question whether the average American tourist ever learns the customs of the Romans. Even people who have lived in the Eternal City fail to observe many of the traits and ways of the Romans in their daily life.

When one visits a foreigner in Italy, the driver keeps to the left. The pedestrians act in the same way. Some foreigners go through Italy from Naples to Milan, and at the end wonder why it was that the Italian persisted in getting into their way.

The native Roman eats two meals a day, one, the colazione, or breakfast, at noon, the other, the pranzo, or dinner, from 7 to 9 in the evening. Black coffee is a favorite drink among the women at the cafe, but tea is seldom used. It costs only 10 cents a cup.

In New York there are morning and evening papers with a liberal outflow of extras between. In Italy the papers reach the public about a week in advance.

At about every school or when classes for the day have been finished you will see a gathering of men and women. These are the parents, who come to carry home the books of their children.

When the family wash is ready, the mother carries the basketful of clothes on her head to the public washhouse, ready for action. Every one loves the queen. She is very devout and every now and then strolls from her yellow dress in plain black and mingle with the workmen in the churches. As for the king—well, that is another story.

Bananas and pineapples are never seen in Italy. As for hand organs and the festive monkey, they are seldom seen in the city streets. A peasant from the mountains bringing in vegetables to sell to the city folks must pay a tax at the gate before he can enter the walls.

There are a great many suicides in Rome, and the favorite way to the end is to throw oneself over the Flaminian wall or to go to the Subura bridge over the Alban hills and leap from it into the rocks 300 feet below.

It is not always the native guide that is the best. One day at the Church of St. Peter a party of American school boys were watching the traffic on the street when a swartly Italian man approached and asked in the poorest Italian if they wished a guide.

"Aren't you an American?" said the boy. "I know you are Americans, an it's funny that you know about Rome in five minutes that a native could in a month."

One grows careless in traveling, and many things slip the memory, but there is one thing that it takes months to get accustomed to—a Roman funeral. At all sights a funeral procession in Italy is the strangest. It starts a man to turn a corner and to come suddenly into a gloomy street where the yellow glare of funeral torches throws grotesque shadows along the house walls.

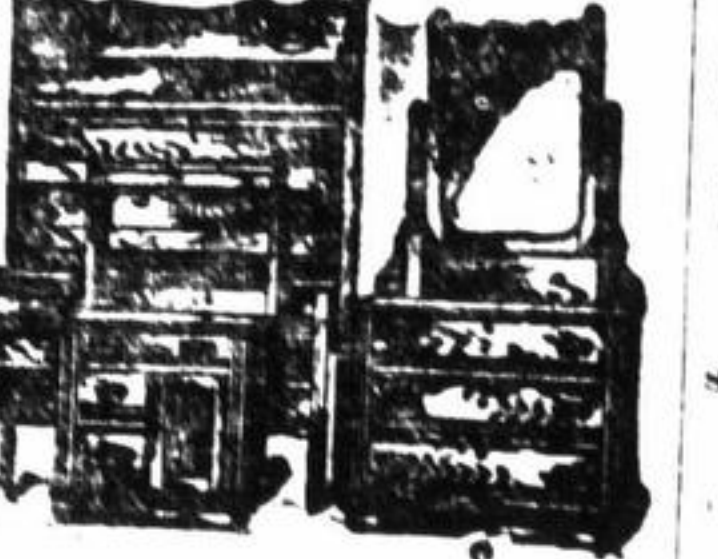

REWARDS OF GENERALS.

Wolsley Gets More Honors Than Did Nelson or Wellington.

Agent the Honors showered on Gen. Kitchener, an English journal remarks: Lord Wolsley has been more handsomely rewarded than any general in the queen's reign—not excepting even the duke of Wellington. On returning from the Red river expedition in 1850, his first independent command, the hard-fights of which may be guessed from the fact that the boats had to be taken ashore and carried past rapids and waterfalls forty-seven times, he was made a knight commander of St. Michael and St. George, and commander of the Bath. Four years passed before he established his name in the Ashante war, and received extraordinary honors. In both houses of parliament a resolution of thanks was unanimously recorded, and he was made a G. C. B., a K. C. H., and a major general, and the city of London presented him with a sword of honor, valued at £100. Besides these honors he was offered a baronetcy, which he declined, and a peerage, which he also declined.

Still there were further rewards awaiting Sir General. In 1882 he commanded the expedition against Arabi Pasha in Egypt, in connection with which he again received the thanks of both houses of parliament, and was raised to the peerage. Three years later came the expedition to Khartoum, when Lord Wolsley was made a viscount. His is perhaps the most continuously successful career in the annals of our arms. He has nineteen letters after his name, all recalling some brave deed, and has certainly received more signal honors than any other living officer.

Nelson's honors were not so highly honored as our present commander in chief. He became lieutenant at nine years and post captain at twenty-one, as he received his first great advance in 1797, in consequence of a splendid act of disobedience. In that year in the battle of Cape St. Vincent, Nelson assembled a Spanish squadron with a single ship, contrary to superior orders, and for this piece of bravery he was rewarded with the Order of the Bath and made a rear admiral. After the battle of the Nile, Nelson was rewarded, with a peerage and promoted to the rank of vice admiral, and in 1801 he was made a baron, the occasion being the battle of Copenhagen. In four years, therefore, Nelson received five high honors for distinguished services.

Wellington's chief honors came from the battle of Talavera, in 1808, and he received no special reward at or after the battle, except the title of viscount. He became the most influential man in European politics. For his victory over the French at Talavera he was raised to the peerage, with the title of viscount.
