LETTERS TO THE EDITOR.

"Anglican" After "Catholic" Kingston, November 3.—To the Editor: Apparently "Catholic" intends to abandon the field he entered with such confident assertion. This, however, does not mean that he has repented of his evil ways, for in last week's Prentiss he, if possible, exerts himself more than ever. At the time of the fifth article of the Church of England, and with the exception of two quite unpintrestable syllables he quotes it correctly. This is so far encouraging. But he proceeds with the same confidence with which he manufactured a royal declaration which never existed, quoted a spurious passage from St. Cyprian, etc., to assert that "this article denies the Catholic teaching, and maintains that each generation must learn the revealed doctrines of religion from an individual study and interpretation of the Bible." This statement is false and without the smallest foundation. The article reads, "Holy scripture contains all things necessary to salvation, so that whatsoever is not read therein, nor may be proved thereby, is not to be required of any man that it should be believed as an article of the faith, or be thought requisite or necessary to salvation." It then defines what is meant by holy scripture and gives a list of the canonical books. Not one word, not one syllable about who is to interpret scripture, nor what means we have of judging their authenticity. But there is one phrase which contradicts the construction "Catholic" places on it. "Not to be required of any man Required? By whom?" asked by the individual himself, who is the author of the article. The words "not to be required of any man" are neither addressed to the private individuals not subtended by them, they were subtended by the clergy, the teaching body of the church, and this body is restrained from teaching as necessary to salvation doctrine not read in scripture as proved thereby. The right of individual interpretation is not even mentioned, much less maintained. Thus "Catholic" comes more convincingly to the point of his article. He need not, however, think this is his only mistake in that article. I restrain from mentioning others solely to spare you space. ANGLICAN.
