COUNCIL OF NINE BRITAIN PROTECTS SUBJECTS.

Spanish Officer Called To Time By British

HAVANA, Nov. 7 Alfred Betaneourb, a British subject, born in Jamaica, was assaulted on Tuesday last by a Spanish officer, who struck him on the side of the head for weating a gold scarf pin the shape of a five-pointed star-the Cuban emblem. The officer ordered Betancourt under arrest and sent him before Gen. Arolas, milipary governor of Havana, who proceed him imprisoned. Mr. Jerome, British vice consul, on being notified of the assault, presented himself at the captain general's palace to demand the in-

stant release of Betancourt. Gen, Blanco at first attempted to put Mr. Jerome off. Then he said it would be an extremely difficult matter to release the prisoner, as he had not been arrested by the Orden Publico, but by an army officer, and had been sent to jail by the military governor. But Mr. Jerome maintained a firm attitude, insisting that he would remain at the palace until Betarcourt was released. Finally his persistence was such ceraful. One Gets Three Years In Kingston For Stealing Jewellery.

OTTAWA, Nov. 7 .-- William Webster, nineteen years of age and resident of Slater street, was sentenced this morning by magistrate O'Gara to three years in Kingston penitentiary for burglary. Wilham Drake and Henry Morgan, Bay street, twenty three and twenty five years of age, were each sentenced to eighteen months in the Central prison for being parties to tle crime. Webster broke into A. H. Frasor's store on Bank street on October 24th and stole \$450 worth of jewellery. He afterwards called on Morgan and took him to his house where the jewellery was. The two then hid the booty in the lumber pile.
