Mariam L. Leeske, in behalf of the Ladies' musical club, asking that the club be allowed the use of Ontario hall for practice Saturday afternoon each week from 3 P.M. to 4.30 o'clock, free of charge. The club will be responsible for hosting. A motion of Ald. Donnelly and Ryan the request was granted.

Petitions Brought In.

Ald. Ryan—From W. H. Crothers, asking for remission of taxes on account of vacancy. Court of revision.

Ald. Toye—From Thomas Hughes, regarding remission of taxes for vacancy. Court of revision.

Reports Of Committees.

Ald. Carson presented the report of the board of works, printed elsewhere.

Ald. Donnelly thought the distance to be covered by the outlet of the Queen street sewer about 600 feet. Would the city be sufficiently remunerated for the outlay?

Ald. McElvey asked if the engineer had been consulted regarding the streets given the city by the Mills estate. Ald. Carson replied that he had and approved of them. Ald. McElvey was satisfied.

Ald. Behan asked if there would not be a job in Willam street if it was continued through the Mills estate.

Ald. Carson replied in the affirmative.

But in the event of this portion of Willam street lying between Earl and Division street being extended the street would be continued straight. The piece spoken of is only forty feet wide, whereas the portion given the city gratis by the Mills estate is fifty-six feet wide. The clause was adopted.

Regarding the continuation of the Queen street sewer, Ald. Donnelly had not any objections to offer.

Ald. Elliott asked if it was so that the board of works was in the habit of constructing drains for private parties.

Ald. Carson replied that such was not the case.

Man employed by the corporation, worn out of work, sometimes undertook to build drains for private parties.

Ald. Elliott objected to this being done.

The board of works should not employ such men.

Ald. Bell thought Ald. Elliott's suggestion a strange one. The council had no right to object to any individual taking up private work.

Ald. Ryan supported Ald. Bell's contention.

Ald. McElvey thought the board of works should not go in a private party.

He knew of one case where the board of works had built an asphalt walk 200 feet long, and what was more, the citizens would pay for the walk unless the city graciously paid the walk for twenty years.

Ald. Donaldson supported the contention of Ald. McElvey.

The report of the board of works was duly adopted.

Ald. McElvey asked why the city did not purchase granite at least for the base of statues. There were many citizens who would lay granite walks, if they could purchase the granite. Ald. Carson said the board of works, which controlled the crusher, could be satisfied to do this. Contractors had rejected the crusher.

The discussion was cut short by the mayor, who declared it out of order, as there was not at the moment any business to that effect before the council.
