

A Weird Phenomenon In Indian Ocean.

SAILORS TELL A STRANGE EX PERIENCE.

Ore w () / The British Steamer Breckonshire Tell An Odd Tale-Ship In Peril From Hugh Waves-Ocean In A Pante For A A Time-Island Is Of Volcanic Origion.

THUADELPHIA, Pa., Nov. 9 .- The British steamer Breconshire, which has arrived from Java with a cargo of sugar, brings a remarkable tale of a phenomenon witnesred while the resrel was but two weeks cut of port and in the southern part of the Indian Ocean

According to the story, which is told in a manner so graphic and so free from ex aggeration as to leave little doubt regarding its genuineness, the captain and crow saw thrown up by a mighty upheaval of the subterranean strata of the ocean's bed a curious island of basaltic formation and which came into existence almost in the twinkling of an eye.

In that part of the Indian Ocean in which the phenomenon was seen there have for years been manifested phenomena suggestive of enormous internal disturb. ances beyond the solution of the average navigator. There is a portion of this enormone body of water which constantly steams with a baleful sulphur-impregnated vapor of such intensity and volume as to cause this part of the ocean to be studious. ly avoided by all mariners. The Breconshire, however, was caught by the fringe of a monsoon and hurried thereby far to the southeast of the usual beaten track pursued by the homeward bound fleet.

On Soptember 15th there was noticed by the man on the lookout, just after right bells, or four o'clock, a cloud loom ing up directly ahead and precenting a most menacing front in the pathway of the advancing craft As fac as the eye could see to the westward the entire horizon wes cocompassed by this wall of steam, into which the captain did not care to venture until the sun would rise in the morning and he could count on at least fourteen hours of daylight. The steamer accord. mgly have to during the few remaining hours of the waning afternoon.

The scene at this time was indescrib ably weind. The eea, in its supernatural alm, showed a surface so unmovable and glassy that the shadowy cutline of the vessel was clearly traced on its bosom by the declining oun, which gleamed like the mouth of a furnace directly ahead, while extending around to all points of the com pass, except to the south, was the mysteri ous wall of vapor rising perpendicularly from the sea. The terrible aspect which nature had assumed terrified the crew and they stood silently with blanched faces staring at these mighty marvels. Bu there was still more to come, and that

during the succeeding night. Shortly after ten o'clock, when a fitful noon had arisen and shed an erratic lustre over the deep, a tremendous booming sound apparently about three miles to the northward apprised the frightened crew that more marvels were about to occur At the same moment, borne upon the bosom of an immense wave, the Breconshire mounted vertically to a point at least twenty feet above her former position on the ocean bed, and, to the accompaniment of an immense upbeaval of water, an island appeared to leeward where all previously

had been but the sea and ak The suddenness of the event almost doprived the crew of their sonses, but they had little time to comment on the phenomenon, being obliged to look to the safety of the re-sel. Is was many anxious moments before that saidty was assured, but apparently as though nature had exhausted herself the sea in a few moments returned again to its wonted tranquility, the ersewhile looming clouds of vapor disappeared like magic and the full moon shed bright paths of silvery radiances across the quies

bosom of the deep. When day dawned a clear view was af forded of the island, and its volcanic origin was clearly established. It consisted of vertical columns of hard mineral arranged resembling very strongly the pictures of the famous Giant's Causeway. It was found to be only a small island, possibly not more than one quarter of a mile in circumference and at its highest point not at a greater altitude than lik) feet. 
