- 1. Do you license all milk vendors? 2. Do you inspect the milk offered for sale each year? 3. If so, state the method? 4. Do you cause a bacteriological examination of the milk? 5. Do you inspect all cow byres and other premises of milk vendors, and how often each year? 6. State the method of inspection of byres, dairies, etc.?
