PATRIOTISM IN PUBLIC SERVICE.

A remarkable spectacle was presented in Edinburg recently when Lord Rosebery, and Right Hon. A. J. Balfour, representing the highest types of patriotism, appeared on the same platform. They delivered speeches in which advice was given to the young men to be patriotic above all things, to have political opinions but to have them in harmony with the interests of the empire were at stake.

Mr. Balfour endorsed the stand taken by Lord Rosebery. It was not a case of agreement as a result of a personal understanding before hand. It was an occasion on which one great mind emanated a want of the empire, a want of men on whom the success of Britain was to be maintained as in the past, and in which another great mind expressed its perfect concurrence.

It is in advice which can be accepted by some politicians in Canada, and very much to their own and the country's good. At this very time, when our leading men and members of the government are in Washington, seeking to bring to a conclusion the conference at which some long-standing differences between Canada and the United States have been discussed, there are those who are actually hoping for failure and glancing over the prospect of it. The conference has been a secret one; at least the progress made by it and the points on which there has been concurrence or non-concurrence have not been revealed. All that is said, therefore, is regarded to the issue under treatment in mere surmise.

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Memory carries one back to the time when another Canadian commission was at the American capital and in negotiation of what is known as the Washington treaty. What a wall went up when it was rumored that Sir John Macdonald had given away the rights of the St. Lawrence! People were inclined to pass judgement without the evidence. But when the treaty came before parliament, and Sir John Macdonald proceeded to explain the name and effect of each clause, the treaty took on a different appearance and men were made to feel that it was possessed of some merit after all.
