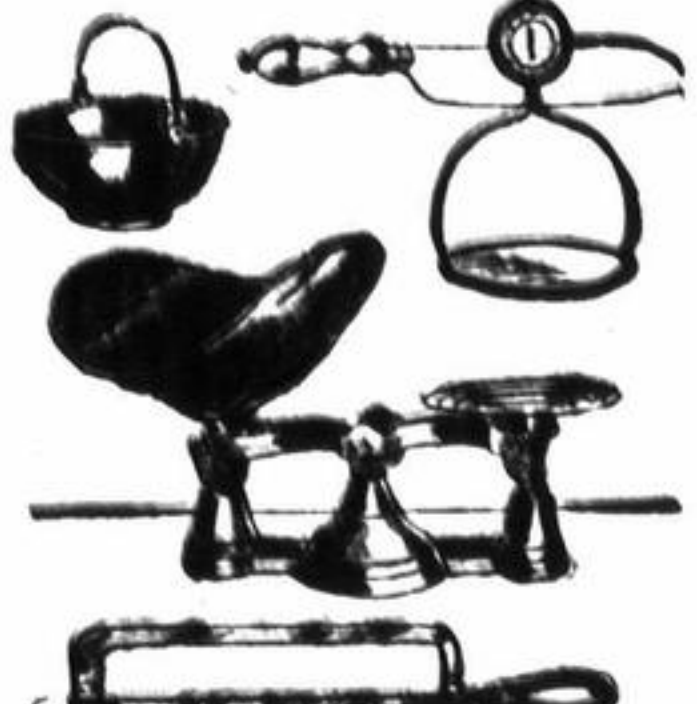

"The authorities, apparently with a view of avoiding the provocation of outbreaks, do not seem to display much vigor or rapidity in the measure necessary to check the propaganda which the provincial papers in many parts of Spain are denouncing daily."
