

THE PULPIT AND THE PEW

ITEMS GLEANED FROM YESTER DAY'S SERVICES.

Rev J. K. McBorine Considered The Question Of Prayers For; The Dead-We Can Only Surmile What Is Going On In Paradise-Rev. Mr. Houston Deplores Members Of Churches Visiting Other

Congregations. Rev. J. K. McMorine, on the evening of Sunday week, preached upon the intermedist. sate of the departed, the probable existence of paradire as a home of the blessed dead in probationary state before admittance to the Great Presence, and as a place of growth in grace. Yesterday morning, as a sequence, he considered prayers for the dead. He read the recent charge of the archbiehop of Canterbury, as a deliverance of weight. There was great difference in the primate's view whether the departed were prayed to ev for They were in God's bands and he may allow our prayers to help them. No harm could arise unless we gave way to dreams and fictions. We do not know, and God has not told us, what is going on in Paradisa, and we must not set inventions. Men are forgiven and die who are not fitted for the blessed abode, and to be finally exalted they must be improv ed if all are to be saved. Prayers for the dead are not forbidden, and ecclesiastical courts have not pron sunced against them, out they were not to be used in public worship except in those guarded terms familiar in the offices of the prayer book. Mr. Mc-Morine proceeded to positively affirm that the Greek, Roman and Anglican churches and Protestantism generally believe that man's life of determining probation is restricted to this world. This is said by some not to be the belief of the Roman Catholic church, but it is misunderstood. its prayers are not meant to save from purgatorial fires those otherwise lost; they

are for the swed, to make them fixed for heaven. All probation ends at death as to the place of future abode. The pronouncement of the council of Trens was read, as to the souls of the right eous betog purified by temperary punishment so that nothing defiled should have place in the highest abode Some differ from this thought, but the weight of opinion was overwhelming in its favor. Side by side with the awful truth f death's inevitable verdict was the posibility of salvation up to the laters minute. The birds should be as nearly as possible of even weights, and the ends of the cases marked with the contents and total weights.
