


MUNYON'S

THE MISSIONARY SERMONS
PREACHED IN TWO METHODIST
CHURCHES YESTERDAY.

Rev. Dr. Henderson of Toronto and Ross of Ottawa Were the Deputation—They Were Heard Gladly and the Mission Fund Well Received by the People.

In Sylvester street, Methodist church last night Rev. Dr. Henderson spoke to a large audience from the words found in St. Mark xii, 15: "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." The command is "GO". It is far easier for us to obey that order than it is for those to whom it was given, the antiquity of the Christian religion makes it many times more powerful today. Take a field of paradise this relation toward wings of many over-aching the strength of all creation. The pagan fathers wanted a new world to conquer for Christ, and so brought the word to the western continent. China's size and population is almost beyond calculation, every third child looks up into the face of a Chinese mother. A multitude of Chinese, four or five times larger than the population of London, is swept into eternity every year without a knowledge of the Saviour. China has not stood the shock that terrible house and thousands of her children can never be sounded. He has a wonderful power of adapting himself to circumstances. Did you ever see a Chinese tramp, beggar or drunkard in Kingston? He can live wherever anyone else can live. Methodism should be proud of its missionaries in that land. It had kindled the beam in fire. The speaker had come to Kingston to aid in spreading that illuminating power over the whole of the celestial empire. Without the blaze of canon and sword and command. He came with the gospel as his only weapon. It might be regarded as the Britain of the east. The factor that he brought about this stupendous revolution is the word of Christ. The church has in its hands a key by which it can lift the Indians into a truer and holier life. The outrages committed among the Indian women and girls are innumerable and disgraceful. Moral evil is also needed in the land still clinging to the usage of prostitution. This has originated in the nation's duty and the charge of the Methodist church to emancipate the Indian mind from the thralldom of ignorance. No better way out of the wealth of our country beaded to than by raising the scale of the people's intelligence. God as God can not save this world without the medium of His only Son, the perfect man. In view of the speaker gave a description of the training of the field of work and the methods used. Foreign missions, thirty-three dollars. Japan missions, eight dollars. West African, three and two-fifths dollars. Missions to the poor, twenty dollars. The most of the day was spent in the study of Miss Shreeve, Miss Bailey and W. Lavelle.
