CUBANS EXCITED.
Prisoners Escape—Cuban Soldiers Occupying the Towns.
HAVANA, Dec. 31.—The Cuban patriot committee, consisting of 150 leading Cuban lawyers, doctors and business men, decided to yield without reservation to the master of posing the six days' celebration and has approved of a manifesto to the Cuban population of Havana.
