

## NEW DIAMOND FIELDS.

They Have Been Discovered in Griqualand West.

London, August 9.—The news comes from South Africa of the discovery of important new diamond fields in Griqualand west, in the same district as the Kimberley mines. Although the first discovery was made at the end of last year, it was not till May last that the governor of Cape Colory proclaimed it a payable diamon field in accordance with Cape laws.

Over 3,000 persons from Kimberley and Barkley rushed to the field and pegged out a large number of claims. These have been tested, and the results, as reported in recent letters and cablegrams, seem put it beyond doubt that the find is a most valuable one, and fully equal to the famous Wessalton mine at Kimberley.


