Ottawa, Aug. 10 .- The Tories who told us that England would never denounce the German and Belgian treaties, that the Governor-General had instructions to disallow or reserve for disallowance any act of the Canadian Parliament running foul of those treaties, and so on, do not exactly know what to say now. The Mail has no sense of proportion or it would perceive that booming the colonies by starving the British democracy and destroying its foreign commerce would be an odd way of consolidating the Empire. Richard Golding, the able secretary of the Cobden Club, who is now visiting Canada, they tell us with one accord that we are only deceiving ourselves when we look forward to preferential treatment for our wares in the British market. Mr. Greenway's project for bonusing a railway from Winnipeg to Duluth, which is to carry grain by rail and water to Buffalo and from there by rail or water to New York, is bound, if it comes to a head, create disappointment and ill feeling in the older provinces. 
