THE ANNOUNCEMENT that the company boring for coal oil in the vicinity of Fredericburg had ceased operations.

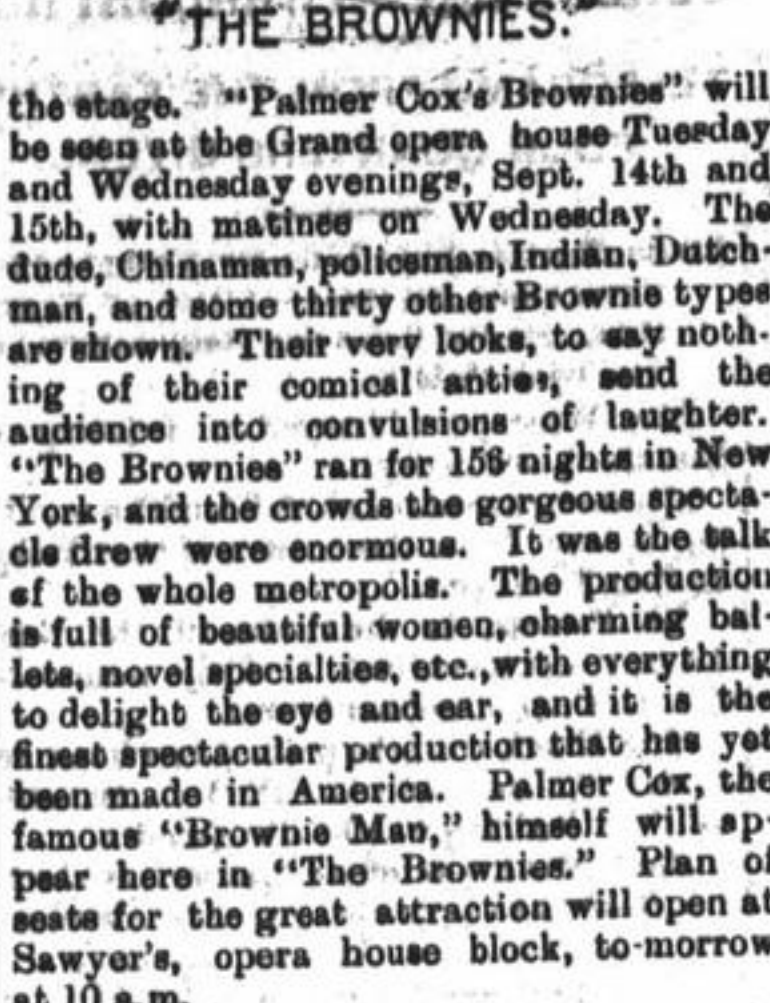
It was thirty-five years ago, said Mr. Miller, that we began operations on the farm of Jacob Clancy.
