ONCE LIVED IN KINGSTON.

HE WAS ENGAGED IN THE CATTLE BUSINESS.

Attached by Cholera, But Was Spared—He Entered into Partnership and Ran the Distillery Until Fire Destroyed the Buildings—Then Returned to Jefferson County.

Benjamin F. Hunt, aged eighty-two, recently married to Mrs. Sherman, aged ninety, at Watertown, N. Y., formerly lived in Kingston. In a sketch in the Watertown Standard we find this extract:

"In the thirties Benjamin and his brother fattened steers for the market. The supplies to feed the British army, stationed on our frontier, and the extensive lumber camps of oak and pine timber, were largely drawn from this side of the line.

"For the purpose of disposing of his fat cattle in the spring of 1832 he went to Kingston. While there he purchased the slops and brewery grains from a large combined still and brewery. He had scarcely entered upon this enterprise when the cholera swept up the St. Lawrence river in a rampant manner, leaving consternation and death in its wake. He could not afford to abandon his stock and leave the country. Being a genuine believer in the faith of his Puritan fathers, he resolved to accept cheerfully whatever the Infinite should decree should be his fate. He was spared, but the man of whom he bought the slops died. The business had proven fairly remunerative, therefore he took keeper of the concern contracted to buy the business, provided the quite extensive funds could be secured. This he did by negotiating with Col. Chauncey Baker, the cashier of the Sackets Harbor bank; but during the following year he purchased the slops of another distillery and married his first wife, who was Miss Sarah Talcott, only daughter of the late Major Daniel Talcott, of Adams, N. Y.
