The Berlin newspapers report that Prince Henry of Prussia, brother of emperor William, is to take command of the German squadron in Chinese waters.

In a breach of promise case at Pembroke, Rawlins vs. Burgess, the matter was settled by Burgess paying \$100 to help Miss Rawlins' expenses.

There is another hitch in running the Intercolonial railway into Montreal, and the date has been postponed until the middle of December or the first of the new year.

A Bohemian newspaper says ex-king Milan, of Serbia, is again seeking to divorce his wife, Natalie, in order that he may marry Artemisia Christie, the divorced wife of Milan's former secretary.

In the course of the trial of Thron for the murder of Goldenupp, Mr. Hrovo, counsel for the defence, announced in open court that he intended to show that the murder was committed by Mrs. Nack.

The Toronto Junction bondholders are promoting a measure for the local legislature for the government of the local commission of three, and the carrying out of a scheme for the repayment of the municipal debts.

MUST ACT PROMPTLY. The Action of Lieut.-Col. Strath Towards Major-General Gascoigne.

OTTAWA, Nov. 26.—In military circles here but one opinion prevails as to the conduct of Lieut.-Col. Strath in censuring and ridiculing Major-General Gascoigne.

The former has shown himself to be lacking in the most elementary principles of a soldier's education and has set a most dangerous example of gross insubordination.

The queen's regulations and orders lay down the stringent rule that no subordinate is to be permitted to criticise or censure his superior officer, and he is not allowed to press him down. He is then to obey orders in respectful silence.

How far Lieut. Col. Strath understands his position is best shown by his recent conduct and at present all eyes are turned on the department of militia in anticipation of prompt and severe punishment.

SOME INTERESTING STATISTICS. Contained in The Report of The English Postmaster-General. The annual report of the English postmaster-general for the year ending March 31st, did not appear until the latter end of October.

Under those circumstances it is felt here on all sides that if the colonel of the Royal Scots is allowed the privilege of slandering the general, such a course is equally open to any officer of the militia who fancies himself aggrieved.

With such a code of order and discipline, the effects upon the militia must be demoralizing, and the public will naturally regard a general, who has no authority, as worse than superfluous.

NOVEMBER CROP REPORT ISSUED BY THE ONTARIO DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE. Less Disease Than Usual Among Live Stock is Reported—Yield of the Grains—Condition of Fruit and Fruit Trees—Areas and Yield of the Crops—Potato Area Not Very Large.

The yield of fall wheat has been large, much of it first-class quality, but a portion is not up to the standard in either weight or quality, as some of the grain "sprouted" during the wet harvest season.

Potatoes were struck by a blight or rot in September, nearly all the older sections of the province suffering. In some places about fifty per cent of the crop was lost, most being taken up, however, the rot has been stayed.

Fruit trees are in good condition. There is not the usual surplus of pears, and apples are scanty and scarce in most parts of the province. Grapes were abundant, but late clusters were caught by the frost.
