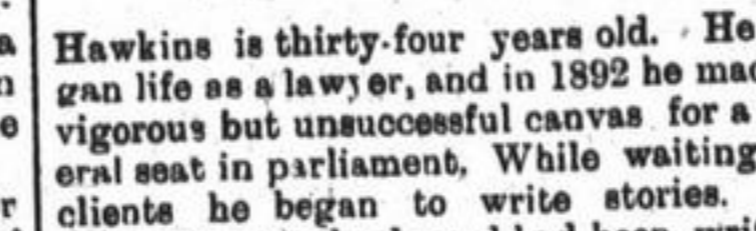

CUT HORSE'S THROAT. A Farmer Then Took Paris Green and Cut His Own. PETERBORO, Ont., Nov. 30.—Sandy word was brought to coroner Bell from Wakefield that a farmer in Douro town, named Henry Davey, who lived alone, was found dead in his house with a cup of Paris green, but afterwards selected a razor, with which he had cut the throat of a favorite horse which he had just bought before destroying himself. He had had a large sum of money in his pocket. Excessive drink is given as the cause. No inquest was held.

PRINCESS WAS POISONED. The Late Crar's Morganatic Widow Meets Her Doom in Salvador. GUATEMALA CITY, Nov. 30.—A report which seems well authenticated, comes from Salvador that princess Dolgorouy, who claimed to be the morganatic widow of czar Alexander II, was poisoned in Salvador by her secretary and an adventurer named Don Castro Sarmiento. She died suddenly and her death was given out as from yellow fever, but the body was disinterred by the authorities, whose suspicions had been aroused, and an autopsy revealed that she had been poisoned. The alleged princess came to this country from Paris under contract to play the violin at the exposition, and left here about two months ago. She was heavily bejewelled, and it is thought her diamonds and the money she carried were the objects sought by the criminals. BINGHAMPTON, N.Y., Nov. 30.—On Monday veterinary surgeon A. M. Coats was called to New Berlin to find out what caused the death of a cow that had departed this life rather mysteriously.
