INVESTIGATION AT KINGSTON PENITENTIARY.

Evidence of the Witnesses who were Before the Commissioners.

THE LENGTHY HEARING GIVEN MR. DEVLIN.

He Was on the Stand For Three Days and Asked Over Two Thousand Questions in Regard to Penitentiary Transactions of Many Kinds.

The engineer admitted that he had experienced a lot of trouble at the institution. "The peculiar requirements of such a vast amount of things I have to look after, it stretches over and covers such a large area and touches so many places. If any of the officers want to make trouble for me it is an easy matter."

"The minister seems to have taken stock in them?" "Sir John Thompson. He was ready to take stock in anything, no matter how wrong it might be, so long as it was done by Dr. Lavell. He must have known that Dr. Lavell was not a very good man."

"The engineer in his defence, declares that his answers are misrepresented in the alleged admissions of trouble with officers. He could not have sworn, he says, to troubles with Sullivan Coffey, Macdonald, or Adams for he never had disagreement with them, as their affidavits will show."

"Is that his general reputation?" "It is his general reputation, founded upon instances of which I could bring proof."

"What if he ever had occasion to think that the ex-warden was dealing otherwise than honestly with the property of the prison, the engineer said that at a prior enquiry the warden had tried to influence him to swear that only twenty tons of coal were used at the penitentiary, whereas there were consumed from sixty to eighty tons."

"The warden admitted to be worth the property of the prison. The flour mill and gas plant were a ridiculous low figure. John O'Connor was given an engine in connection with his contract for installing the binder twine plant. Considered the sale of the gas plant very unwise and opposed it. There were many ways in which it could have been made use of."

"I was not aware he was breaking the rules of the prison by bidding on or purchasing the goods. The warden approved of him purchasing the appliances. Denied having ordered any pieces of pipe two feet or so long. Two letters were produced in the engineer's writing, proving he had ordered some pipe conforming with a "porcupine boiler." The pipe cost \$10 a foot. Did not know who the pipe was ordered for. The two pieces cost \$25 and \$16.25 respectively.

"A double cylinder bicycle. Certainly \$100 would not purchase what material went into the construction of it. Yet it was thrown on the scrap iron pile after the men made a couple of attempts to go around the yard on it. I have known a dynamo to be made there and the material in connection with it cost very much more than this pipe. It was afterwards taken by the warden's son."

"Does the warden assume to exercise authority over all these?" "He does in a way, not authoritatively so, sometimes in a way that it would not be pleasant."

"You felt as if you thought he was exercising authority to the extent that gave him privileges?" "I would not like to say 'yes' to that."

"Can you say 'no'?" "No, sir, I could not say that either."

"The deputy had taken sometimes a few nails from the stores without applying the regular form. A team brought the materials of the old building over to the dock. Usually, the deputy warden had the detailing of the men at their various employments. Mr. Tracey was the trade instructor at the time the work was being done on the boiler and engine. The material was charged in connection with the boiler and engine. If the deputy took a man from any of the trade shops an account would be kept against him for the time he would be away, but if he took a man from the stables no time would be kept."

"Did you see any trades people about?" "No."

"Did you see anybody about it except those around the prison?" "No."

"Did you see anything about it?" "Yes, twice."

same steam pipe as the blacksmith shop, therefore, the cause of idleness there must be the same. The engine in the blacksmith shop was much out of order. One day the wooden plugs they had driven into it, blew out and the men had to run. The steam pipes leading to it also leaked and one convict was scalded in passing them. The warden informed me that this machinery was unfitted by the control of the engineer, and he was to see that it was kept in order. It was complained to me that some of the best men were taken from the blacksmith instructor and incompetent men put in their places. Some of the men taken were used in positions not requiring a skilled mechanic. Mr. Harrigan stated to me that this was a great hindrance to his work. There was some trouble over the removal of a skilled mechanic named West.
