THE DAIRY MARKETS.

What the Week has Produced in this Commodity Worth Noting. Kingston Cheese Board. Kingston, Oct. 27.—On Saturday night the Kingston Cheese Board held their final meeting.

The quantity of potatoes received during the week had caused a drop in quotations to 80c. per bag. Farmers who had good tubers rushed them to the market, in the hope of securing the figures ruling last week.

The quantity of apples put in the market has been great. Good winters range in value from \$2 to \$2.50 per barrel. Many kinds can be secured at \$1 upwards.

In the small fruit department the dealers are selling quinces at 50c. per peck; grapes and malaga 25c. per lb.; other kinds of grapes have nearly disappeared.

Coal dealers say the price must advance, possibly about November 1st. Toronto has sent its coal up 50c. per ton. It is worth \$6 there. It may be \$6.50 to \$7 here in another week.

This year the receipts of grain have been light. Farmers are holding off and will only sell when compelled to do so. The arrivals will drag along all winter.

He is Mobbed by the Tories at Brintford—Feted with Botten Eggs. London, Oct. 24.—It is now evident that the parliamentary campaign will not pass off without serious rioting in many quarters, as the party feeling, which was already high, daily grows more bitter.

The Marquis of Lorne, Liberal candidate for Hampstead, went down to Brentford, a town seven miles west of London, to deliver a campaign speech. While addressing the electors a mob assaulted him with rotten eggs, and some of them, gaining the platform, smashed his hat over his head.
