#### NEWS OF THE WORLD.

##### THE TELEGRAMS FROM THE EARTH'S FOUR QUARTERS BRIEFLY GIVEN.

**The Little Things That Affect Canadians.**—Signs from Europe and What They Portend.—A little of everything easily read and remembered.

**Senator Plumb** wants a place in the cabinet.

**Riel** was hung in effigy at Watertown on Wednesday evening.

There have been three deaths from small pox at Watertown.

The North-West rebellion medals will be distributed before Christmas.

**Harris Veinburg**, Montreal, has suspended; liabilities \$21,000.

Two men want to hang **Ben. Simmons** in London on the 27th.

**C. A. Bauman**, a German, insane, starved himself in Victoria, B.C.

**Michael Hurley** was knocked down in Toronto and robbed of \$10.

**Dr. Grandbois**, M.P. for Temiscouata, is reported to be down with small-pox.

**Fryer**, Brockville, convicted of forgery, has been sent to the Central Prison for 18 months.

**Mrs. Fortin** threw her boy off the train at Montreal because he had the small-pox.

Another evidence of an early general election—a caucus of the Ontario Opposition at Toronto.

A man named **Hurtleise** died in the Grey Nunnery, Montreal, aged 100 years and ten days.

The Indian murderers of **Payne** and **Tremont**, N.W.T., have been sentenced to hang on Nov. 27th.

Some 305 houses are reported placarded in Montreal; 700 houses are said to be infected with small-pox.

The chief of police, Toronto, has resigned and a host of people want his place. Salary, \$2,500 a year.

Hog cholera still rages in Western Ontario; 1,600 animals have died since the outbreak in Essex and Kent.

Because an apprentice went to work in **McPherson's** shop, Hamilton, three hundred of the men quit work.

A **Prof. Hewitt**, who gives concerts in Montreal, has sued the *Gazette* for \$1,000 for ridiculing his performances.

The Toronto students who hung a corpse before a butcher shop are to be arrested and punished.

**Judge Wilson** has decided that a seat on the Toronto Stock Exchange cannot be sold by a broker's creditors.

Once more the lifting chains attached to the Quebec have parted and the steamer **Jehn** is afloat.

**Major John Hopper**, an insurance man, has lit out of Montreal, leaving several thousand dollars liabilities.

**George Milligan**, Toronto, has sued **J. M. Fortie**, cigar-maker, for \$5,000 damages, for arrest under a capias.

The Montreal Isolating Committee applied for \$1,431, wages of police, and \$63 for verifying doctors. It was paid.

**James McQuirk**, farmer, East Nisouri, was found hanging to a rope in his own stable. He was in financial difficulties.

The firearms with which one family in Montreal kept off a posse of policemen, on vaccination errands, were loaded with pass.

**F. X. Dumont**, working in a drain in Montreal, was buried, the excavation carrying in. He was rescued, but cannot recover.

A meeting of the Federal Cabinet was held yesterday, and it is understood that they decided to carry out Riel's death sentence. In consequence there is talk of Chapleau's resignation. Mr. Thompson, the new Minister of Justice, is said to have made a report to the Council, favouring the despatch of Riel to an asylum.

#### BRITISH AND FOREIGN.

The wife of the Tichborne claimant is dead.

The Russian harvest of 1885 is above the average.

Catholic missionaries have converted 545,000 Chinese.

The Pope has recognized Spain's sovereignty over Caroline Islands.

Greece has placed large orders for Nordenflicht guns and cartridges.

**Lady Benedict** is engaged to marry a son of **Mr. Lionel Lawson**, of the *Daily Telegraph*.

Servia and Bulgaria have not disarmed their forces as requested by the Powers.

The Duke of Edinburgh has been appointed commander of the Mediterranean squadron.

Emperor William beseeches the kings of Servia and Greece to abstain from disturbing the peace.

The Nationalist convention, London, elected **J. M. McCarthy** as its candidate for parliament.

The British Tories favor a retaliatory policy against Spain in the matter of customs duty. Sensation in Spain.

The Grecian Chamber of Deputies has voted to £480,000 to purchase iron of war, and authorized a patriotic loan of £1,200,000.

Volunteers in the Bulgarian army mutinied. The leader, a Russian, suffered death, and another penal servitude.

The German government has prohibited the passage through Germany of guns purchased in France for Servia. They go via Austria.

A Russian dragonman has been making a tour of the Roumelian villages, fomenting an agitation against Prince Alexander and in favor of Russia.

The Irish Defence Union comprises three dukes, four marquises, fourteen earls, a score of lords and viscounts, and many members of the House of Commons.

**John Bright** opened his campaign at Birmingham. He regretted that both parties had blundered in their foreign policies, and deprecated fighting with or annexing Borneo.

Some 6,000 rebels are advancing towards Waddy Halfa. The Durban regiment has received orders to start for that place on Sunday. A battery of artillery will follow the regiment.

Prince Alexander is concentrating a fleet of vessels and a large number of troops near Widdin with a view of attacking Belgrade, the capital of Servia, by way of the Danube river.

The school board elections in England are declared to have been disappointing having resulted in the return of an inferior body of men, the majority of whom are simply pledged to a reduction of rates.

The British election prospects are now summarized:—Liberals, Britain, 310; Liberals, Ireland, 4; Tories, Britain, 163; Tories, Ireland, 16; Nationalists in Britain and Ireland, 79; doubtful 76.

As a result of the elections for members of the Prussian diet the strength of the Lower House is as follows: Conservatives, 140; Free Conservatives, 60; Clericals, 99; National Liberals, 70; New German Liberals, 44; Poles, 14; Danes, 2; Goelphs, 3.

The St. Petersburg *Novoye Vremya* learns that Prince Alexander intended to dismiss the Russian officers in his service, but that Russia called them and thus forestalled him. Russia is not, however, hostile to Prince Alexander.

The steamer **Constantine**, chartered by Cork cattle dealer, boycotters, while proceeding to Liverpool with cattle, grounded in Cork harbor, but floated this morning unhurt. The cattle dealers charge the loyalists with bribing the pilot to willfully ground the **Constantine**.

Over \$12,000 have been raised in Rochester for a soldier's monument.

The liquor appeal case comes before the Privy Council on the 11th.

The U. S. army cost \$3,051,735 last year, and the navy \$17,154,929.

Fish, ex-ambassador, is acting as assistant to the chaplain to Auburn prison.

A heavy snow storm is prevailing along the Union Pacific line and coming eastward.

The **New York Times** calls **W. H. White** Reid, of the *Tribune*, a personal sneak and habitual liar.

A team of the New York baseball club is going to make a tour of the southern cities and Cuba.

**Lizzie Merchant**, aged 16, was ruined, deprived of her clothing, and for months cast in a room in Boston.

Work resumed in **Roach's** ship yard, New York, completing the cruisers; 300 men will be employed.

The government has accepted the despatch-boat **Dolphin**. The courts will determine her value.

Ex-Senator **Sharon**, millionaire, whose divorce suit attracted world-wide attention, is dying in San Francisco.

**Cyrus Yondas**, a millionaire, grief-stricken at the loss of his father, blew his brains out at St. Paul, Minn.

The Oswego yacht club has organized for next year. It has 36 members, and has expended \$2,000 in improving its property.

**Henry Ward Beecher** was robbed of a valuable gold watch as he was entering an elevated train in New York on Tuesday.

**Dr. L. E. Hall**, of Pittsburg, aged 73, has been found guilty of causing the death of **Lena Stenbench** by malpractice.

The Catholic Church in America is against the liquor traffic. The manifesto of the last plenary council creates a sensation.

Major **Stanley**, a New York book-keeper, who embezzled \$4,500, has fled to Canada with a married woman, who met him in Buffalo.

**Alexander Newburger**, a New York jeweller, who embezzled \$6,000 in diamonds on Wednesday, a thief smashed the widow and grabbed the jewels.

Last night **James Campbell** was walking up street, Albany, Oregon, with a young lady, his affianced, **Capt. R. N. Saunders**, of Corvallis, editor of the **Benton Leader**, stopped behind him and fired two shots. Campbell died from the wounds.

The committee examining into the management of the Maryland house of correction report a disgraceful state of affairs. The superintendent is charged with the most inhuman treatment of the prisoners, as well as, of gross mismanagement.

#### WRONG APPOINTMENTS.

Judges Passed Over and Violent Partisans Selected as Revising Barriers.

**L. E. Johnston** points to the fact that judges of long standing and unquestioned independence like Chief Justice **Street** and **Judges Jette**, **Payson**, **Tascheron**, **Bourgeois**, **Pineau**, **Cassault**, **Caron** and **Reuther**, have been passed over for such a man as **Judge McQueen**, but lately a colleague of **Sir John's**, and such recent supporters of the party in power as **Judges Gill**, **Martin**, **Langranger**, **Cimon** and **Brooks**. It charges, however, that the other appointments are still worse, most of the appointees being active and unscrupulous partisans, and some of them being notoriously intending candidates at the next Provincial elections, who will not hesitate to avail themselves of the occasion to further their own interests.

But the most serious charges made by **L. E. Johnston** refer to the appointments which have been made for Belleschasse under **Montgomery** upon the recommendation of Messrs. **Amyot** and **Landry**, the two members for those counties. It says that the selection of **Notary Hebert** for **Montigny**, and of **Notary Mackenzie** for **Belleschasse** amounts to a veritable recognition by public authority of the most flagrant political dishonesty; the former, who is also the Inter-colonial station agent at St. Thomas, being the man who was publicly stigmatized by the law courts for his infamous share in the nocturnal robbery of the **batloo** boxes by which the **Liberals** were her elect for **Montigny** was swindled, for a time, out of his seat, and the other being the individual, who as a witness in the contestation of **Col. Amyot's** seat for **Belleschasse**, publicly swore that he was not responsible for his acts, and who only escaped personal condemnation in a prosecution for intimidation and corruption by swearing point blank that he was such a confirmed drunkard that no one took his threats seriously.

**Married in haste**, etc.

Every day proves the truth of the old proverb, "married in haste: repent at leisure." About 40 years ago a young couple in Connecticut eloped. The other day an old and feeble woman, who had left home with her son and his wife in an open wagon at 2 o'clock the same morning, tottered up to the court room and asked for a divorce from her husband, aged 83, who had recently run off with a widow. The old couple took their time about repenting, but they did it at last.

#### ELOPED WITH MY WIFE!

A CLERGYMAN ACCUSED OF IMMORALITY AND HUNTED FOR HIS LIFE.

The Audience Turned Into a Howling Mob The Purse Open Turns Upon Them and Seriously Stabs Them—A Terrible Scene Ensues.

Plymouth, Eng. Nov. 6.—Rev. **Stewart Ross**, formerly rector of **Christ Church**, Belfast, Ireland, was addressing the Plymouth Young Men's Christian Association last evening, when **Charles Joy**, Canadian emigration commissioner, burst into the room and shouted, "You hypocrite, you eloped with my wife!" Ross turned pale and fled from the room. His audience was surprised and greatly excited. In a moment many of them realized what was the matter. They became a howling mob, and pursued the lecturer for a mile, yelling all the time. At this point Ross, who was breathless and driven to bay, turned suddenly and stabbed two of his most active pursuers. Others coming up at the moment seized and disarmed the numbers rector. The police then put in an appearance and arrested Ross.

He was taken before the magistrate to-day, when the charges were lodged against him, and he was remanded a week without bail. It transpired that Ross disappeared from Belfast two years ago, leaving a wife and three children. Mrs. Joy, who was a teacher in his Sunday School, also disappeared at the same time, which led to the report that the couple had eloped. This rumor was confirmed when Mr. Joy received a letter from Ross, in which the latter said: "Your wife has undergone my practice and you had better arrange for obtaining a divorce from her." Mrs. Joy was found in the prisoner's lodging, and when informed of her paragon's arrest gloried in her connection with the "**Lord's** annointed," as she called her illicit lover. She attended court to-day and sat in a brazen manner throughout the whole proceedings.

#### MURDERED ON A FARM.

A Hired German Killed off by an Imported Englishman—A Young Victim.

Galt, Ont. Nov. 6.—A murder was committed this afternoon at the farm of **Levi Weber**, near the village of **Strausberg**, about eight miles from here, in **Waterloo County**. The murdered person is a young German farm hand, name unknown, about fifteen years of age, recently from Germany, and has been working for **Mr. Weber** for the past six months. The supposed perpetrator of the murder is said to be **John Calvin Ravier**, a young Englishman about seventeen years of age, who was brought to Canada as an orphan and was formerly employed on **Mr. Weber's** farm, but left about a year ago. He returned to-day during **Mr. Weber's** absence from home and went to the barn, where he was told the young German boy was waiting. Upon **Mr. Weber's** return home he found the murdered boy in the barn, the body being covered with chaff. A long wound across the forehead, extending down the face, was visible and a broken club lay near by. **Mr. Weber** immediately set out to notify the coroner, and to find the suspected murderer. The search was traced to **Blair station**, where he took a train for Galt. It was discovered that he left Galt for **Harrisburg**, making eastward. **Chief McFeggan** started after him and captured him near at **Harrisburg**, and brought him back to Galt. **Mr. Weber** states that he cannot assign any motive for the commission of the crime as he does not think he supposed murderers and victim ever met one before to-day.
