CHEQUES ON BANKS -- It has been an old usage England, after signing a cheque, for the drawer, or the person in whose favor it is drawn to write across it the name of the banker of the latter. When this is done, custom makes it the rule that the banker upon whom it is drawn shall not pay it to any one who may present it at the counter, but only to the banker whose name is written across the face, or, at any rate, to some banker.
