He seemed to be satisfied with one peasant a day, and was induced to adopt a certain hour for the killing. At the appointed time the king would go to a certain window in his castle with his gun, and a peasant would stroll by, apparently on some every day errand. As he passed a certain spot the king would raise his rifle and fire, and the peasant would fall down as if killed. But, as the king's attendants had been careful to leave out the bullet in loading the gun, the peasant would really be unhurt, and when some of his companions would rush out, pick up the supposed dead body and bear it away on a stretcher, the mad monarch's thirst for gore would be quite satisfied for the day. Otto's mother, Queen Marie, is still alive.

She was born Oct. 15, 1825, married March 12, 1842, to King Maximiliau Il, and widowed Oct 10, 1864. She is very democratic in ber tastes for a queen, mingles freely with the people, and wears very plain garments. Consequently she is loved and respected throughout the length and breadth of Bavaria.

Francis Named for Governor.

Mayor D. R. Mr. Francis was named and accepted as a compromise candidate. He was elected. Mayor Francis is called "The Mascot" by his political friends, from his un.form success.
