

A BY-LAW

To aid and assist the Napanee, Tamworth and Quebec Railway Company by granting a bonus thereto of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars, for the purpose and upon the conditions therein mentioned and con-

() HEREA's, by an act of the parliament of Canada passed in the forty second year Her Majesty's reign, chaptered sixtyseven, the Napanee, Tamworth & Quebec Railway Company, hereinafter called "The Company" was duly incorporated.

AND WHEREAS, by an act of the legislature of the Province of Ontario, chaptered 184 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1887, municipalities are authorized to grant bonuses to any railway company in aid of such railway.

AND WHEREAS, it is proposed by the company to connect their railway from a point at or near the present terminus at the village of Tamworth, in the Township of Sheffield, to a junction with the Canadian Pacific Railway at or near the village of Tweed, in the Township of Hungerford.

AND WHEREAS, it is expedient to grant a bonus of seventy five thousand dollars to the company to aid and assist in the construction of the said extensions.

AND WHEREAS, the amount of the debt to be created by this By-law is seventy-five thousand dollars, and the object for which it is created is to carry out the grant of the said bonus, and it is necessary for this council for the said purpose to raise the said sum of \$75,000 in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

AND WHEREAS, the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property of the municipality of the City of Kingston for paying the said debt and interest, as hereinafter provided, is \$4,076.

AND WHEREAS, the amount of the whole rateable property of the said municipality, for the said municipality, being for the year 1888, is \$7,160,240.

AND WHEREAS, the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said municipality, other than the water works debt, is \$389,-041.71, and the water works debenture debt is \$258,900, making a total existing debenture debt of \$647,941.71, and no part of the same or of the interest thereon is in arrear.

AND WHEREAS by Section 11, of an Act of the Legislature of Ontario, passed in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign, chaptered fifty six, it is provided that this council may extend the period within which the debentures hereinafter mentioned shall be payable to forty years from the date

BE IT, THEREFORE, enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kingston, as follows :

1. It shall be lawful for the said municipality to aid and assist the Napanee, Tamunder the conditions hereinafter contained.

said municipality, to cause any number of debentures to be made for such sums of money as may be required, in currency or sterling money, not less than one hundred dollars each, Canadian currency, or twenty pounds sterling, and that the said debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the said municipality, and signed by the said mayor, and countersigned by the treasurer of the said municipality, and together shall not exceed the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars.

3. That the said debt of seventy five thousand dollars shall be made payable by annual instalments within forty years from and after the day this by-law takes effect, which day shall be the date of the issue of the said debentures, and so that the amount falling due in each year shall not, together with the interest payable in each year, exceed the said sum of \$4,076 and so that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest, in any year of the said period shall be equal as nearly as may be to what is payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of the said period, and the said debentures shall be issued accordingly, and shall have attached to them coupons for the payment of interest thereon as hereinafter provided.

4. The said debentures shall be dated on the day this by-law takes effect, and shall bear interest at and after the rate of 12 per centum, per annum from the date thereof which interest shall be payable half yearly on the first day of the months of July and January in each year at the office of the said treasurer in the said City of Kingston, or in Great Britain or else-

where.

5. For the purpose of paying the said debentures and the interest to become due thereon an annual sum of \$4,076 shall be raised in each year of the said period of forty years by a special rate sufficient, therefor, in addition to all other rates to be raised, levied and collected in each year of the said period of torty years, upon all the ratable property in the said municipality during the currency of the said debentures.

3. That the said debt of one hundred and fifty housand dollars shall be made payable by an nual instalments within twenty years from and after the day this By-Law takes effect. Which date shall be the date of the issue of the said debentures, so that the amount falling due each year shall not, together with the interest payable in each year, exceed the said sum of \$11,585, and so that the aggregate amount pay able for principal and interest in any year of the said period shall be equal as nearly as may be to what is payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of the said period, and the said debentures shall be made accordingly and shall have attached to them coupons for the payment of interest thereon as hereinafter provided.

(e) AND UNTIL the Company has executed deed whereby it covenants and agrees wit the said corporation, that from and after the construction of the portion of their railwa, between Kingston and Smith's Falls, they w permanently and efficiently maintain the train service on such portion with not less than one ted, from Smith's Falls aforesaid, timed to ar rive at Kingston aforesaid between the hours of eight and eleven in the forenoon, and on such train timed to leave Kingston aforesa. for Smith's Falls aforesaid between the hours of one and eight in the afternoon with a proviso that in default thereof the said corporation by injunction or otherwise compel the maintenance of such efficient train service beside any other remedy which may be open to said corporation on said deed. Also that the Company will maintain its head offices and the City of Kingston. Also that the Company will not charge any greater rate on cord wood from Smith's Falls to Kingston or from any point between Smith's Fall and Kingston to Kingston than nine dollars for each car carrying six cerds of hard wood.

(f) THAT on compliance with the conditions hereinbefore contained the said trustees shall pay over the said debentures with interest coupons attached and cash received on account thereof to the company, at the rate of \$2,500 per mile, as sections of five miles in length from Kingston or from a point of commencement nearest thereto as hereinafter mentioned. are completed to the satisfaction of an engineer to be nominated by the said corporation, and the balance when the railway is completed from Kingston or said point nearest thereto to Smith's Falls with daily trains running between Smith's Falls and Kingston as hereinbefore provided. And it is hereby provided that the Company may enter into an agreement with the Grand Trunk Railway Company and the Kingston and Pembroke Railway Company for the use of such portion of the Railway of either of said companies near Kingston or the terminal facilities thereof as the company may deem advisable, in which case construction will commence from the portion of either of said railways in regard to which such arrangements have been made, and provided that such junction shall not be further distant from the City of Kington than seven miles. (g) That the said portion between Kingston

and Smith's Falls shall be completed with steel rails, weighing not less than fifty-six pounds to the lineal yard, within five years from the time this By-Law takes effect, and in default thereof then said debentures and coupons or those to be substituted herefor as hereinafter provided or the unearned portion thereof shall become null and void and the trustees shall deliver the same with the cash received on ac count thereof to said treasurer for the use of the said corporation.

(h) That except as hereinbefore provided all of the interest coupons which accrue due before the company becomes entitled to them or before any sale thereof made by the said corporation as hereinbefore mentioned shall te detached from the said debentures or those to be substituted therefor as hereinbefore mentioned and delivered by the trustees to the said

corporation as they accrue due. ing entitled to the said debentures or those to be substituted therefor as hereinafter mentioned or any portion thereof the company shall also pay to the said corporation in cash any interest accrued between the maturity of the last half-yearly coupons for interest and the date of the company becoming entitled, it being the intention that except in the case of a sale as aforesaid interest shall run only from the date of the company becoming entitled.

(i) THAT the said corporation either by means of a sale of the said debentures or those to be substituted therefor as hereinafter mentioned shall have the right to substitute cash in lieu thereof at any time prior to the de livery of any portion to the company and thereupon they shall be handed back by the

trustees to the said corporation. (k) THAT the said debentures or those to be substituted therefor as hereinbefore mentioned shall be accepted by the company at the par value therefor,

(1) THAT the said corporation at any time before the delivery cfany portion of the aid debentures to the company on being authorized so to do as hereinafter mentioned shall sub stitute therefor other debentures of the same face amount payable in the period of forty vears, and thereupon the said debentures and coupons and any cash received on account thereof shall be handed back by the trustees to the said corporation to be cancelled and lawfully disposed of, and the passage of this By-Law by the ratepayers of the said city is hereby declared to be an authority to the city council thereof to petition the Legislature of the Province of Ontario for the passage of an Act authorizing the said city council to pass with out further assent from the ratepayers a By-Law for the issue of debentures payable within forty years for the same amount and for the same purposes as the debentures here n authorized, and to be substituted therefor as hereinbefore mentioned.

(m) THAT the company shall give the said trustees fifteen days notice in writing of the application for the delivery of the said debentures or either of them.

(n) THAT the Kingston, Smith's Falls and Ottawa Railway Company, the Grand Trunk Railway Company and the Kingston and Pembroke Rallway Company wherever mentioned in this By-Law shall be taken to include their successors, lessees and assigns and any Rail way Company, with which they, or either of them respectively, may amalamate or form a


