As at least an equal curiosity we may refer to the columns of News and WHIG for a precisely similar journalistic coincidence. But one journal in North America, so far as we know, has been fool-hardy enough and sufficiently ill-advised to raise any other standard. All sects and parties at all infected with the spirit of the age not only admit but cordially and strenuously enforce the political axiom. The few exceptions in the City of Montreal will only serve to prove the rule, and meanwhile, even they must accept the fair and sensible ruling of the vast majority of all creeds and classes.
