ANOTHER RUSSIAN CHECK

RUSSIA'S RESERVES CALLED OUT

London, July 25. - The only movements announced this morning are a check austained by the Russian at Pievna and the repulse of a Russian assault on Silistria, but no particulars are given in either case. In the West the Montenegrins are said to have captured all the forts around Nicsics, and in Asia Minor the Russians have entirely disappeared from the district of Bayazid. Turkish massacres of Christians are reported at Kavarna, on the Black Sea, north east of Varua, and an English war sloop, with several Austrian Lloyd steamers, have gone to that place to receive the fugitives.
