Chicago, July 31.—On Tuesday evening Gale Hollingsworth, of White Pigeon, Keokuk county, Iowa, was shot and killed by Miss White, for alleged adultery. She was afterwards arrested and presented him with a written statement confessing he had causelessly slandered her, demanding him sign it. He denied the charge and refused to sign the paper, upon which she drew and fired, killing him, not fatally. He ran and she pursued, firing a second shot, which took effect. He climbed upon a fence, when, overcome by his wounds, he fell to the ground, leaving an attempt to arrest him, placed the muzzle of her pistol to his head and fired a third time, killing him instantly. Hollingsworth was a middle-aged, well-to-do farmer, and leaves a wife and family. Miss White is a young lady of good family, who has never borne a good character. At last accounts she had not been arrested.

MAJOR'S POLICY.—President MacMahon has arrived at Bourges, where the Mayor presented an address. The President in replying said his sole aim had been the maintenance of peace abroad and constitutional order at home. His intentions and acts had been misrepresented. There had been no violation of the constitution or interference with the liberty of conscience, or jeopardizing of foreign relations. Public good sense at home and abroad had estimated these claims at their true value. They would not discourage or interfere with the country's interests and check the pacific development of its greatness. Alluding to foreign affairs the President said France had done all in her power to localize the war in the East. "Peace," he said, "is the first policy in French policy."

A DEPUTY IN CANADA.—William F. Goldie, the defaulting teller of the East Canada Bank, Natural Bank, has turned up. It will be remembered that on the 30th of April he left, taking \$3,000 with him. Ince, his speculator on at one time and another footed up to over \$5,000. Ince was a great scoundrel and not a trace of him was ever seen until on Wednesday the bank received a letter from Goldie, dated at Paris, Oct., which contained a proposition to voluntarily make up all the rest of the money. The cashier of the bank in his power, proceeded to Paris, and had an interview with Goldie yesterday, who turned over \$1,400, every dollar he had left. He had visited Newburg, Baltimore and other cities, and had sailed from New Orleans for Liverpool, spending thirty days in Europe, but his conscience would not let him rest, and he returned to New York, and thence to Paris, Oct., from where he wrote to the bank officials.—Detroit News.
