Ontario Teachers' Association. The following is a synopsis of the preceedings of the Annual Convention of the Ontario Teachers' Association, Tuesday evening: - At the close of the discussion. which arose over Mr. J. H. Smith's essay on "Township School Boards," the motion of Mr. J. H. Knight, to the effect that the system of township boards, as provided for in the School Act of 1877. is likely to prove a great improvement on the present sectional system, etc., was put, and carried. Mr. Dickenson then moved, seconded by Mr. W. W. Tymblin, and it was resolved, "That, inasmuch as by the free school system the wealthier residents of a section assist the poorer in the education of their children, to be consistent it should be enacted as soon as possible that wealthy sections in a township should assist in supporting the weaker sections by a system of uniform township taxation." Discussion thereon was, by resolution, adjourned until the evening session. A motion was carried appointing the hours of meeting from two to five e'cleck, p.m., and from 7:30 p.m., until adjournment. After the opening of the evening session, Mr. J. Seath moved, seconded by Mr. McMurchy, "that the following be a Committee to wait upon the pro-Minister of Education in reference to the publication of the results of the late Teachers' Examinations for first and second-class certificates, viz. Messra. McAllister, Dickenson, Mc-McIntosh, Milar, and the Callum, The motion was at length mover.

THE COUNTESS OF DUFFERIN. To the Editor of the Herald :-

I have refrained hitherto from taking any notice of the various untrue reports that have appeared in the New York papers relative to the yacht Countess of Dufferin, but your issue of yesterday contains so many errors in connection with the matter that I beg to send you the following statement: -The yacht does not owe a cent to any one. Cuthbert, who owns a share of \$1,500 in her, payable upon a certain contingency, which in all human probability will never arise, is a debt personally for a large amount in Canada, without any means of paying. 317 Broadway, N.Y. He owes Wilson, the sailmaker here, for sails furnished for a small sloop yacht which he built in Canada last winter. He also owes Williamson, of Stapleton, for money lent and hotel bills. In the meantime, I am kept here with the yacht, ready for sea, provisioned and watered, with a full crew of Cuthbert's. Where the shoe pinches both Wilson and Williamson is that they have to pay all the expenses of the Sheriff, which amounts to far more than their
