

**** WASHINGTON NOTES.

The National Capital would be a most iestrable place of residence but for the few weeks of saltry heat during the sum-mer. The winters are mild and pleasant, and the spring and automs most delightful. The markets are five, and every year we are entertained by America's most gifted artists. Natural scenery in this vicinity is unsurpassed, and as abundance of artistic and historical exhibitions are here in permanent institutions. I copy a paragraph from one of our city journals: "The bright sky which Washington enjoys almost perpention toally makes it specially adapted as a home for the fine arts. Mr. Walter, the proprietor of the London Times, in a speech made at the opening of an Art Exhibition, lamented the disadvantages which art soffered from under the gloomy sky of that country as compared with that of France and Italy. This capital is most fortunate, for the climate of Washington gives us an amount of sunshine

not surpassed by Paris, Florence, or any other city on the globe. Recents have brought the labor question to the front in the files of political matters needing attention and legislation. It is appounced that a considerable portion of the President's message, at the opening of the next session of Congrees, will be devoted to it. The Cabinet discussions of late have been CHEAPEST IN THE CITY, Posters, &c , &c , executed cheaply neatiy and largely in regard to it, and among other projects mentioned is the apress, representing labor, commerce and capital, for the purpose of adjusting disputes like those from the effects of which the country is now suffering. Of all the Cabinet members Secretary Thompson appears the most disposed to grapple with the problem of labor. He argues that the Government itself can, and therefore must, have its work done as cheaply as private parties. He begins naturally, with his own Department-that of the Navy - and as a step toward the proposed end, he has ordered employees in the navy yards to be paid by the hour. His course, will, doubtless, be objected to by some, but not by those whose approval or disapproval is particularly significant.
