A ROMANCE OF QUEBEC.

CHAPTER I. In the old seaport town St. Malo, in France, there died more than two centuries ago, of an epidemic disease, a fine young Freuchman and his beautiful wife. By the death of her parents, the little Felicie was thus thrown upon the world at the tender age of four years. The father's fortune had been ample, but in consequence of his sudden death, it fell into hands which greedily closed upon it, leaving the orphan maid without means of
