





This was a few days before his death. Others testified to the same effect On the morning before his death Fradette quarreled with Glenn. He died in great agony the same night. Another witness deposed that he visited Fradette's house after his death on Sunday evening, and conversed with the prisoner, who said he had died from the effects of a cold. Prisoner said next morning that her husband might have died from eating poisoned cakes which she had put down the cellar to poison rats. She said she had seen him coming out of the cellar eating something. An inquest was held on the body, and the medical testimony was that deceased had died from strychnine. Prisoner had had an interview with Glenn after the inquest, when he said he must have given strychnine to deceased by mistake. Evidence was also given as to the intimacy between Glenn and the prisoner -a witness having seen Glenn kissing her a month previous to the death of Fradette. Other acts of improper intimacy were sworn to. A witness also testified that on one occasion when deceased said he was ill treated and was going to the States, the prisoner said he would not live long enough to go there, but long enough to be a little more trouble to her. ### A Tramp's Terrible Ride.
