Among all the discussions of our school system, we do not remember having seen the suggestion that pupils' Savings Banks should be introduced into our public schools. It appears they have been in successful operation in the 'old country for some years, and the matter has been considered sufficiently feasible and important to elicit discussion at the recent session of the Social Science Association. The operations of such an institution are briefly discribed by the N. Y. Evening to talk about. Post. Once a week an hour or so is set apart for the collection by the teacher of the surplus pocket money from pupils. Each of the latter is furnished with a card on which the dates and amounts of deposits are entered, similar entries being of course made in a book kept for that purpose by the master. DARING AND SUCCESSFUL SURGICAL PERATION. - Our correspondent at Campbellton, New Brunswick, states that on Friday, the 5th inst., a remarkable peration was performed by Dr. Balcom, Campbellton, assisted by Dr. Venner, on the person of Archibaid Chatteran, a young man of about twenty one years o belonging to that place. Young Chatteran had been suffering for some time with consumption, his right lung being completely softened and broken down, with the exception of a small portion at the top. His death was hourly expected for several weeks past. Dr. Balcom, concluding that he could not, in the course of thirgs, recover, resolved te open his chest, which he did by making a deep incision at the lower end of the shoulder blade, and inserted a silver tube, through which he drew out about two quarts of exceedingly offensive matter, and afterward washed out the gavity thoroughly with disinfectants. The patient experienced immediate relief, his strength and appetite have returned in a great measure, and he is now able to walk about the house; whereas, before the operation, he could not turn himself in bed. From the marked success of the operation, and the fact that the patient's lung is comparatively sound, his friends now entertain strong hopes of his recovery. Dr. Balcom claims that this is the first operation of the kind performed in credit on his skill and courage as a sur-
