COURT COUNCIL.

Friday, Nov. 9.

APPROPRIATE SESSION.

The Council resumed at 1:30 o'clock.

The discussion on the Treasurer's case was taken up.

Mr. Spooner remarked that he had listened to the debate yesterday.

He considered that Judge Macdonald acted only as a Commissioner; that he had no right to give an opinion—simply to take evidence and report thereon.

The Judge's making a recommendation had put his feet in it.

There could be no doubt that the general report was against the Treasurer.

He discussed some of the charges in particular, holding that if the by-law regulating the salary in the first place had not been signed he should not have taken advantage of it, thus taking \$800 when he was appointed to receive but \$600.

It was sufficient to cause them not to sustain Mr. Irvine.

They would not keep a servant man if he acted thus.

The Treasurer was no different, inasmuch as he was a public servant.

But they had Mr. Irvine for years as Treasurer, and they could not point a finger in any mistakes which he had made in his accounts.

He put the whole case in a nutshell, saying that he had known what he had done for years before he spoke of them.

He would advise that if their conduct was as good as Mr. Irvine's had been it would not redound so much to their credit.
