The "Times" on the Commissioners" Decision,

A Times' editorial on the Fisheries Award says :- "It is to be hoped that the award of the Halifax Commission will become the basis of a final settlement of the dispute. Necessarily it cannot of itself be final. Half the period for which the mutual concessions were settled has expired, and unless something be done in the interval, all the old difficulties will re-appear five years hence. But we may hope some day to hear the last of these Fishery disputes. Saturday's award may accelerate this hat py deliverance.

Obviously much negotiation will be need ed between two Government. "In regard to the argument that a decision must be unanimous to be valid, we still hold the opinions we expressed whea we showed how unsubstantial the pleawas-when first seriously urged three months ago-that a reference to a Board containing representatives of the disput ing parties would be no reference at all. If unanimity were required it would be submission in form, with a reservation reducing it to a nullity. Too clearly it is an essential prerogative of a mixed arbitrating Board to decide by majorities for the matter to be open to argument. No doubt the United States Government will see the common sense of this view, and acquiesce in the award. The Commissioners' decision against the Canadian claum of compensation for permission to United States fishermen to buy bait and ice at Dominica ports is undoubtedly right. In any case it would have been difficult to estimate the value of the privilege of buying supplies. Call and matter has long been in dispute, and some kind of arbitration will again be

ngcessary if we wish to have it settled. "The full text of the award will possibly contain the estimate framed by the Commissioners of the yearly value of the fishing privileges conceded. If the valuation commands any degree of acceptance, something might be done to settle the whole business once for all by payment of a capitalized sum for concessions in perpetuum, regard being had as the pro-bability of further decline or extinction. This object would be worth aiming at. Unless it is by some means secured, we shall be troubled with a perpetual recurrence of the difficulty with constantly increasing dimensions. Attempts will certainly also be made to mix up with the fishery question the negotiations for a reciprocity treaty between Canada and the United States. This should be avoided. Fishing privileges always remain occasions of dispute, unless a permanent of. tlement be made admitting the ballermen of both countries to pursue their avications side by side as if they belonged to the same nationality. It will be a slur on both Governments if a settlement of

this matter be not effected!"- Globe.
