HE MUST PAY \$250 TO SET FOOT ON AME-RICAN SOIL.

The House bill of Mr. Shelby regulating Chinese immigration, proposes a per capital tax of two hundred and fifty dollars upon every subject from China, immediately upon entering the United States after the first of January, 1878, excepting officers or accredited agents of the Chinese Government and their families coming to the United States in an official capacity. The tax to be collected by certain officers under the direction of he Secretary of the Treasury.

It is also made the duty of the cellec-

tur of customs to certify to the United States Attorney of their respective districts within five days after their arrival the number of Chinese passengers arrived in their respective custom districts who have not paid the tax, and also designs tions of the means of conveyance by which they have arrived. Such means conveyance are also made liable for a tax if not paid by passengers, an i must be preceeded against by United States Atterneys immediately after receiving nod tice from the customs officers. The bill further provides that every Chinese subject who enters the United States without paying a tax, be prosecuted in the United States Courts, and upon conviction be punished by imprisonment at hard labor for not less than five years, and that no payment of the tax subsequent to the arrest be accepted in bar, or save him from liability to punishment.
