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TARRED AND FEATHERED.

THE ELLISVILLE OUTRAGE AIRD IN THE COURTS.

Five Men Accused of Committing the Assault—Two Men and a Woman Driven From a House—One Man Disfigured—Her Night Robbery an Aftermath.

The Athens Reporter has a full account of the trial of Thomas McMillan, James Dillon, Michael Dillon, Thomas McConnell and Wm. McConnell, accused of assaulting and disfiguring with tar and feathers Justice (Lawley and Motion, before George Livingston, testified that about sixty persons surrounded his house. A number entered it and carried him into the yard. It was a bright moonlight night. He proceeded: "They pulled the drawers of my shirt and took my shirt off. They did not succeed in getting it off. When I got out into the yard I knew my assailants. They had their faces blacked up. Their names are: Thomas McMillan, James Dillon, Michael Dillon, Thomas McConnell, and Wm. McConnell. There was also a man named John McMillan, who had a stick in his hand and came toward me. They daubed tar on me. I did not know them. They pulled me by the neck of my shirt and pulled me into the yard. The two men assisted to carry me to the creek. Where they pitched me in. I was about two and a half feet deep. I was positive in my mind that I was there. I came back and pulled me out. I think if they had pulled me out I would have been drowned. I was tired shaking up I got into the house. It was a cold night when they pulled me into the water. They left me lying on the back and then went away. When I recovered I went to the house. I knew the prisoners ten or fifteen years and only live about a mile from them. I know them all by their identity. I spoke when he was getting the rail, but I do not remember of William McConnell speaking. The party tried to blindfold me when they first took me down stairs and also tried to put me blindfold when in the yard. They did not succeed in keeping me blindfold. George Bracken warned me at a time. He was positive in my mind that I was a racket by the boys if I did not get rid of Mr. Kelly."

William Livingston, father of the previous witness, related his experience. After he was carried outside, a quilt having been wrapped about his head. After taking the quilt off my head I saw that the two McConnells were holding a rail, and Michael Dillon with the rest of the crowd persons named were with me in the yard. They had a little black oil on their faces. I never got away from the five persons named were the men I saw the five persons trying to maul my son on the creek and then dragging him in. Thomas McConnell and Wm. McConnell did this. After George was pulled out of the water, he was carried to the house. George and I were carried to the house. George had tar on his face. He was positive in my mind that I was a racket by the boys if I did not get rid of Mr. Kelly."
