THE PROTEST SETTLED AT THE COURT. HOUSE THIS MORNING. The Statements Made By the Counsel-It Is Admitted That Some Of Mr. Harty's Enthusiastic Supporters May Have Been

The trial of the petition of Thomas Moncrief against the return of the Hon. Wm. Harty came to a sudden termination this morning. When the court adjourned yesterday afternoon it was generally underdence, and it was commonly known last night that the case had been disposed of so far as the counsel had the power to dispose of it. No one was surprised, there-fore, this morning on court resuming, when S. H. Blake, Q.C., counsel for the respondent, arose to make a statement.

Mr. McCarthy, counsel for the petition er, said: "In regard to the petition I am quite satisfied, from my instructions, that we can establish bribery to a very large extent, and I think that, under the statute, your lordships would come to the conclusion that the election should be voided. In regard to the personal charges, on investigation, I have advised my clients that they cannot succeed, unless, indeed, your lordships should decide that, from the extent to which bribery did prevail, the respondent must have known of it. That, of course, would be problematical."

Mr. Blake said that his admission went so far as that corrupt practices had prevailed, but that a close examination of Mr. Harty had failed to fix any charges to him personally, "We admit," said Mr.
