




A Premium for Wine Drinking. Thrifty people who attempt to solve the domestic-servant difficulty by living in cheap hotels at the seaside during the summer months and dining in restaurants in London during winter are beginning to complain of an innovation which hotelkeepers and restaurateurs are making in their system of prices. Hitherto it has been the custom to charge a fixed price for the meals. If the diner drunk wine he paid extra for it; if he confined himself to water it made no difference in the price of the dinner. Now, however, it is announced by several hotelkeepers that if no wine is taken the meal is charged a sixpence of a shilling more, and where board is arranged for the sum per day demanded is from 50 cents, to 62% cents higher from tectotalers than from wine-bibbers. The custom is also creeping into table d'hote dinners in London; and at one or two restaurants in the West End where fixed prices obtain it is announced on the
