## MAY HAVE BEEN OVERDOSED

TOO MANY PLATITUDES FROM  
THE PULPIT.

What Archdeacon Lauder Had to Say in St.  
Paul's Last Evening — The Church  
Shaking off the Nightmare—Archbishop  
Lewis' Address.

Yesterday was celebrated the forty-  
ninth anniversary of the erection of St.  
Paul's church, and the services were ar-  
ranged with especial reference to the oc-  
casion. The band of the 14th Batt., P.W.  
O.R., assisted the choir at both morning  
and evening services, and the effect of the  
combined music—vocal and instrumental—  
was grand.

The Bishop of Ontario preached the  
morning sermon from St. John xii. 14.  
"What doth it profit, my brethren, thought  
a man, say he hath faith, and have not  
works? Can faith save him?"

The very reverend speaker pointed out  
the absurdities of a mere profession of  
faith in Christ without the good works to  
which faith should urge.

"Can faith save the man?" he asked, "who  
professes to believe in the Lord Jesus  
Christ, and who never wears of making  
known the circumstances, but who is not  
moved by the tenets of that faith to do  
the works which it would urge?"

He showed that God requires of his crea-  
tures more than a life-long, quiescent  
repentance before they can expect to become inheritors of the  
kingdom of heaven. The value of true  
and living faith lies in its providing us  
with motives for good works.

"Depart from me, ye cursed," is a faithful  
warning of what will take place on the day of  
judgment. Faith alone will not save the  
multitude who have nothing else to recom-  
mend them.

"He who will ask himself, 'Will my  
faith save me?' will be led to study and  
consider the question until it arrives at  
the conclusion that the faith of the vast  
majority of church members is not a saving  
faith, that it is not the active impulsive  
motive that urges to good works. He will  
be led to ask of himself, 'Does my faith so  
affect my soul that the atonement of Christ  
becomes a reality?' It does it, if you like."

True faith is made up of doctrines re-  
ceived directly from heaven and meant to  
supply motives for our conduct. It urges  
us to good works done to the honor of God,  
and without which no faith can be truly  
saving.
