



Opposition Speakers Criticise the Bill, But Make No Suggestions.

Toronto, March 31. On no day this session has there been such a large and interested attendance at the legislature as the license debate attracted last night. Every available corner in the chamber was occupied, and so interested were some of those present that they applauded the re marks of the speakers on more than one occasion. Mr. Marter opened the debate with a written speech, in which he criticized the policy of the govern-ment in its past and present temperance legislation, but said little of the attitude of the opposition on the question. He, in common with the other opposition speakers, strongly condemned the clause which permits mulincipalities to regulate the hours of closing, claiming that the GURTAINS government had done this to shirk to aponarbility. Mr. Hardy delivered a masterly address in reply to Mr. Marter, and in defence and explanation of the proposed bill. He read a letter from Sir Oliver Mowat, in which the late premier entirely endorsed OIL-CLOTHS the government's interpretation of his remarks before the temperance deputation. Mr. Whitney followed in a short speech, in which he said that the opposition would be willing to assume the responsibility of settling the question when they get into power, but hinted that in the meantime they were within the lines of Torres Vedras. After speeches by Hon. Mr. Ross, Dr. Meacham, Mr. Haycock and Mr. Crawford, the bill was read a second time without a division. Before the orders of the day were taken




