

For a Controlling Interest In a Frontenac


County Silver Mine. Belleville Sun. The Sun the other day spoke of a rumor which had come to its attention that United States capitalists were negotiating for a share in the mine of silverbearing galena in Barrie township, Frontenac county, which is the property of Col. S. S. Lazier. On the colonel being asked about the rumor, he stated that, while United States capitalists had negotiated for a share of the mine as stated, an offer has since been made to dispose of the controlling interest to an English syndicate, for £50,000 sterling.

Should Not Interfere. A large space is set apart in the heart of the city for the sale of farm and garden produce. This is done not so much for the convenience of farmers who have produce to sell as for city people who want to buy ( farm and garden stuff. Farmers are not compelled to go to the market square to sell their produce. They are at liberty to (1) take it anywhere they please within the city—to sell it wholesale to green-grocers or to peddle it from door to door. But if ( they take their waggons to the market square and reserve space there, they are required to pay a fee for the privilege.

For it is a privilege, not a right, that they Now the Herald holds that so long as the farmers are not compelled to sell their stuff on the market square, but may save the fee by selling it wherever and how ever they please, it is none of the business of the provincial legislature what fees are charged on our market. If the fees are too high, farmers will not go to the market to sell their stuff. That the fees are not too high is proved by the fact that the farmers would much rather pay them than go elsewhere in the city to sell their produce. This meddling with city markets the interest of farmers is not going to
