

The accession of the young Queen worked a revolution in the popular British ideas of royalty, as well as in the duties of statesmen and the procedure of the court. Month by month public interest grew in connection with her appearance, her actions, her words, and everything she did, until it culminated during the wildly enthusiastic days of the Coronation. Old people wondered at her vast responsibilities and opportunities for good; the young dreamed of her reputed beauty and goodness and fairy-like surroundings of greatness. She stirred the hearts of statesmen and poets and the most practical of men into a feeling of almost romantic loyalty. Veteran soldiers, like Wellington, and blase men here. Mrs. G. E.
