LICENCE COMPENSATION.

The Salisbury government has narrowly

escaped defeat and doesn't appear to realize the fact.

In the decision upon the license measure, taken in the house of commons, the ministry had a majority of only four, a circumstance which it was attempted to explain away by saying that many of the supporters of the government were at the assent of the house.

The explanation does not appear to have been very well grounded, however, of which fact abundant evidence was supplied in the withdrawal of the compensation feature of the license act. Without this clause the bill becomes of really no value or effect.

The license men wanted some promise of protection against loss by the removal of licenses, and the purpose is to pay them something when the county council saw fit to revoke the permits to do business, which the licensees really are. The government recognized the liquor party as a strong one—vigorous and determined in action and of great pecuniary assistance in campaign work—and so made ready to favor them in the way which they appeared most, in the way most calculated to affect their pockets. As might be expected the temperance people and the prohibitionists were aroused, and so was the press, and so effective was the attack on the government that it hastily withdrew the compensation feature. It hoped, thereby, to escape further and disastrous criticism, but based its calculations on erroneous assumption. That is, it unsuccessfully sought a successful support of a still going on levying taxes for a purpose, uncertain and suspended, and against such a proposition the liberals and home rulers, and even the unenlightened went with a persistency that knew no weakening. What the upshot of the issue will be no one can tell, but it is quite clear to say one who has followed the discussion that the government has lost prestige by its blundering action and cannot recover its position. Perhaps its experiment will convey a lesson to those in Canada who have advocated a settlement of the liquor business on a similar basis, and have so far failed to induce the majority to endorse their views. "Compensation" is not any more popular in Canada than in the mother country. The moral requirement of the day is asserting its power to the right direction. Education and improved tastes are contributing a corrective influence in public opinion and making it harder to folio upon the masses schemes that do not commend themselves to the better judgment. The peculiarity of a business cannot be gauged when its existence depends upon the law of the land, and that

is the case.
